

Speaker of the House Briefing Notes

Before the Debate:

- 1. Check which debate you have been allocated to chair and the room that the debate will take place in. Please write all of this information down.
- 2. Check that the room is fully set up for the debate. Make sure that desks are available and set-up for the adjudicators, with fresh score sheets, a notepad, a pencil, and a reference guide.
- 3. Meet your teams as they enter the room and introduce yourself to them.

During the Debate:

- 1. Bring the audience to order.
- 2. Read out the following introduction:

As world rules allow points of information, no interjections are permitted between the teams or form the audience. Any points of order will be ruled on the adjudicators.

At the end of each speech, a period of 2 minutes will be allowed for the adjudicators to make their notes. At the end of that time, a bell will be rung to show the debate will restart. If adjudicators finish before the 2-minute bell, I will introduce the next speaker after they have indicated to me that they are ready.

BRIEFING NOTES FOR TIMEKEEPERS

Before the Debate:

- 1. Check that you know which room you are in, and who is your Speaker of the House.
- 2. Once in your room, ensure that there is a bell, stopwatch and timekeeping sheet. Should any of these items be missing, collect them from the Tournament Logistics Manager. Make sure that the items are in proper working order and that you know how to work them.

During the Debate:

- 1. Sit yourself at a desk in the front row with your bell, stopwatch and the time recording sheet.
- 2. Time the Debate as follows:

The times for main speeches in the Debate are:

[Senior School Division:] 1 bell at 1 minute; 1 bell at 5 minutes and 2 bells at 6 minutes. Continuous bell(s) at 6 minutes and fifteen seconds until speaker stops speaking.

[Middle School Division:] 1 bell at 1 minute; 1 bell at 4 minutes and 2 bells at 5 minutes. Continuous bell(s) at 5 minutes and fifteen seconds until speaker stops speaking.

The times for the replies will be:

1 bell at 3 minutes and 2 bells at 4 minutes. Continuous bell(s) at 4 minutes and fifteen seconds until speaker stops speaking.

Please note the times for each speaker and have these available for the adjudicators if requested.

At the end of each speech, please time 2 minutes and ring a bell. This is to tell the adjudicators that the Debate will now continue. If they have already indicated to the Chair that they are ready to start before the 2 minutes is up and then do not ring the bell.

After the Debate:

After the FINAL ROUND deliver the bell and the stopwatch back to the Tournament Logistics Manager.
